FOREWORD

On March 12, 2020, I sent out an email to other crossword constructors to gauge their interest in building a set of charity puzzles to raise money for COVID-19 relief. Many of these constructors had contributed to previous charity puzzle collections such as <u>Puzzles for Progress</u>, <u>Queer Qrosswords</u>, and <u>Women of Letters</u>, and this felt like a good way to get involved during a crisis that none of us had ever experienced before. The response was both gratifying and overwhelming — so many puzzle makers were eager to participate that it soon became a much larger project than I had ever anticipated. Within a few weeks, dozens of constructors had submitted puzzles of all sorts.

Over the next couple of months we worked hard at building, editing, testing, and fine-tuning each puzzle that you'll find in these pages. But though we remained committed in our original goal to raise funds for coronavirus-related charities, the nationwide protests against police brutality in late May gave us an opportunity to reconsider our project's mission. By then there was no doubt about how we would proceed — we agreed to use this puzzle collection to benefit groups such as Black Lives Matter, bail fund charities, and racial justice organizations as well. I'm very proud to have worked with a group of people who are not only highly talented puzzle makers, but share a commitment to using their talents to support worthy causes.

Grids for Good is the result of that commitment. Inside you will find 42 puzzles of varying difficulty by 44 different constructors. The set includes themed crosswords, themeless crosswords, variety puzzles, and metapuzzles, identified for your convenience in the Table of Contents. The puzzles come from a wide range of interests and constructor voices, some of whom you may recognize from various crossword publications, while others are fairly new (some constructors' contributions to this set are among their first-ever published puzzles!). We were even fortunate enough to be given some extraordinary artwork by the talented illustrator Charles Montpetit. Everyone involved in this project approached it with a love of puzzles that we hope you'll see reflected throughout the collection. Most importantly, we hope that Grids for Good can brighten your day just a little bit and provide you with some laughs, some pleasure, and some comfort during an increasingly turbulent period of our lives.

Thank you for your support and enjoy the puzzles.








